How did you learn about the Scholar Rescue Fund?

The Scholar Rescue Fund (SRF) provides fellowship assistance for threatened scholars seeking refuge through temporary academic positions at universities, colleges and other institutions of higher learning. SRF exerts extensive efforts to build strategic partnerships with host institutions on behalf of SRF fellowship recipients. If you are awarded an SRF fellowship, SRF expects you to start your position at the host institution within 12 months of the award. In order to ensure that you will be able to start a position at a university outside Iraq within 12 months, you should begin the process for requesting a sabbatical during the SRF application process.

In addition to the application form and questions below, please provide:

- 1) A copy of your most **up-to-date CV** which should include:
 - a) Your current position (location, dates of tenure, professional title);
 - b) Your previous positions (in chronological order: location, dates of tenure, professional title);
 - c) A list of all of your publications (journal articles, books, chapters) including the name of publication, title of work and date of publication; and
 - d) Other relevant academic work (including supervision of Master's and Ph.D. theses, conference presentations, grants/honors/awards, professional affiliations).
 - 2) At least **two (2) letters of reference, with a typewritten date of when the letter was written:**
 - a) At least one letter should be from academic and/or professional colleagues who can speak to your research, publications, teaching or other advanced academic experience.
 - b) At least one letter should be from a colleague or person who is aware of the difficulties that you have been facing as well as your professional background. Letters from colleagues both inside and outside Iraq are helpful. These letters can be combined with an academic/professional reference.
- Please address all letters to the **Iraq Scholar Rescue Project**.
 - We understand some candidates may not be in positions to safely request letters of reference. If this is the case, please inform SRF staff.
